In the Loop A Summary of the August 2023 English Commission Meeting

Committee and Other Reports

- 1. San Francisco Presbytery
 - a. St. Paul's Presbyterian Church Though the congregation has closed, \$20K was awarded to St. Paul's and designated for building repairs and deferred maintenance. There are ongoing efforts to sell the property at a favorable rate to a nonprofit group based in the neighborhood to maintain ministry related services in the community.
 - b. Book of Order The 2023-2025 edition has been published and will include new church policy requirements such as antiracism. https://www.pcusa.org/news/2023/7/17/the-new-book-of-order-2023-2025/
- 2. Mission and Evangelism
 - a. Study Halls in Chinatown The public library in Chinatown is scheduled to close temporarily for renovation and seeking alternate space to operate in the interim. M&E is continuing their fact finding to determine whether a study hall is needed in Chinatown and what the requirements are to start up this educational service.
 - b. Vision Free Clinic Representatives of M&E and Lion's Club met to discuss the idea of PCC hosting a vision clinic in Chinatown. Free services would include vision examinations, screening for eye problems, and referrals to obtain free or low-cost glasses. The Lion's Club would provide optometrists, equipment, and volunteers. Hosting a free clinic may be an opportunity for the three worshiping communities to work together. To proceed, M&E will need to present the project proposal to and obtain approval from the Commission, Building and Finance committee and Session.
 - c. Accompaniment The first training session was completed, and three additional persons expressed interest in this ministry to asylum seekers. A follow-up meeting will be held to discuss what has been learned and whether accompaniment ministry is a good fit for the EWC.
 - To Do: Elders and the whole community are encouraged to watch the training video, deepen their knowledge and understanding of immigrant accompaniment, and determine what key questions still need to be addressed during this exploratory phase.

d. United Church of Christ Philippines (UCCP) - Rev. Ivie Francisquete-Apole, Eunice Bejar Lee's former pastor in Sucol, made an urgent appeal for support on behalf of UCCP ministers. There has been a resurgence of arrests of pastors who are engaged in organizing workers and in calling for government transparency. M&E approved a donation of \$500 to support the UCCP defense fund for pastors and church-related workers who have been arrested doing union and land reform organizing.

3. Resource

- a. Volunteer Acknowledgments Dave Soohoo will be compiling, updating, and publishing the annual list of volunteers who help staff church operations and ministries.
- b. Membership We have 111 active EWC members in the PCC.

4. Worship & Nurture

- a. World Communion Sunday will be celebrated on October 1. Dave Miller will be organizing fellowship time after the service for the three worshiping communities.
- b. Retreat There are 31 registered. Reading materials will be prepared by our facilitator, Rev. Leslie Veen.
- c. Worship Attendance Approximately 1/2 to 2/3 of worshipers come in person (#s in parentheses). There are ongoing discussions about how to encourage the community to come in person.
